

“Peace at Last” - Isaiah 2:1-5

Isaiah son of Amoz received this message about Judah and Jerusalem:

² In the last days the mountain of the LORD’s Temple will be the highest of all mountains. It will be raised higher than the hills.

There will be a steady stream of people from all nations going there.

³ People from many places will go there and say,

“Come, let’s go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the Temple of the God of Jacob.

Then God will teach us his way of living, and we will follow him.”

His teaching, the LORD’s message, will begin in Jerusalem on Mount Zion and will go out to all the world.

⁴ Then God will act as judge to end arguments between nations.

He will decide what is right for people from many lands.

They will stop using their weapons for war.

They will hammer their swords into ploughs and use their spears to make tools for harvesting.

All fighting between nations will end.

They will never again train for war.

MAKE YOUR OWN POPPIES:

Use red poster paint (or similar), maybe pens or pencils, and colour some red poppy-shaped circles, maybe with a bit of a swirl, on a piece of card (thicker paper will do). Cut them out in the shape of a poppy

Find some green straws (paint white paper ones if you need) or pipe-cleaners, or even make your own by just tightly rolling green paper. Stick them to the back as the stems and make a display.

You could even make a circle of card and stick your poppies on as a wreath.

 peace and learn to love not fight,


Thank you that we can now sing and

Here are some poppy
 outlines to print out.
 You could colour them,
 paint them,
 or cut them out
 round the lines
 including inside the petals
 and the leaf.

 as suncatchers.
